The Gospel for the 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B is Mark 8:27-35. In this passage, Jesus asks His disciples, "Who do you say that I am?" Peter declares, "You are the Christ," marking a turning point in understanding Jesus' identity. Jesus then reveals that He will suffer, be rejected, and be killed, but will rise after three days.
